Aquarion Water Company extends voluntary watering restrictions

Due to a lack of appreciable rainfall this past weekend and very little rain projected for this week, Aquarion Water Company is extending its voluntary water restrictions in Fairfield County through Friday, July 16.

This includes:

- Watering lawns on alternate calendar days, depending on address (People with odd-numbered addresses water their lawns and gardens on odd-numbered days from 5 and 9 a.m., or 7 to 9 p.m.; people with even-numbered addresses would water during those time periods on even-numbered days)
- No washing of boats, cars, and other motor vehicles at home
- Sweeping sidewalks, driveways and decks instead of hosing them down
- Covering pools when not in use to prevent evaporation.

Charles V. Firlotte, President and CEO of Aquarion, stated, “With this extreme heat, it is important for all our customers to assist in this important effort, to ensure everyone in our entire at-large community has the water they need, when they need it.”
