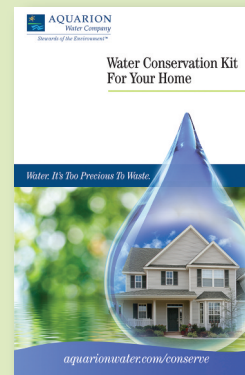

Did You Know?

Most U.S. public water systems use small amounts of chlorine to eliminate potentially harmful parasites, bacteria and viruses. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention consider drinking water chlorination to be one of the ten greatest public health achievements of the 20th century. Most Aquarion systems are treated with chlorine, and we're working to add that treatment level to all remaining unchlorinated systems.
