

An illegal campfire last month started a fire in the 15,300-acre Centennial Watershed State Forest, which buffers the drinking water supply for thousands of people across Fairfield County and provides important habitat for a wide variety of wildlife.



Fortunately, firefighters were able to extinguish the fire before it endangered the watershed. But the incident serves as a reminder to anyone enjoying the forest to follow the rules not only for their own safety, but also for the sake of the people and wildlife who depend on the health of the forest and the watershed it protects.

While the rise in wildfires in western states creates headlines, we shouldn't forget that dry weather in the Northeast has raised the risk of fire in Connecticut's woodlands, too. As dry leaves build up on the ground this fall, be especially careful burning anything outdoors — even in a seemingly safe fire kettle or ring.
