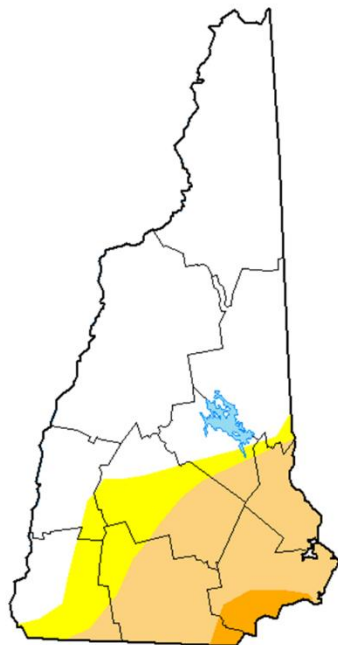
Weather Trends/Outlook

Rainfall in July was close to normal (3.3 inches compared to an average of 3.6 inches). Recent precipitation has been closer to average and drought conditions are slowly improving (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).

Water use restrictions are currently in place only for Abenaki's customers in Bow. All residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions later this spring and summer.
