
Weather Trends/Outlook

January was slightly drier than normal; 3.0 inches compared to an average of 3.1 inches. Rainfall has been below average every month since June 2025 and Severe Drought conditions persist in the region (see the U.S. Drought Monitor map below).







Through the winter season, there are no water use restrictions currently in place for Abenaki's customers yet residents are encouraged to use water conservatively. Less demand over the winter will help local aquifers recharge thereby lowering the probability of water use restrictions next spring and summer.
