

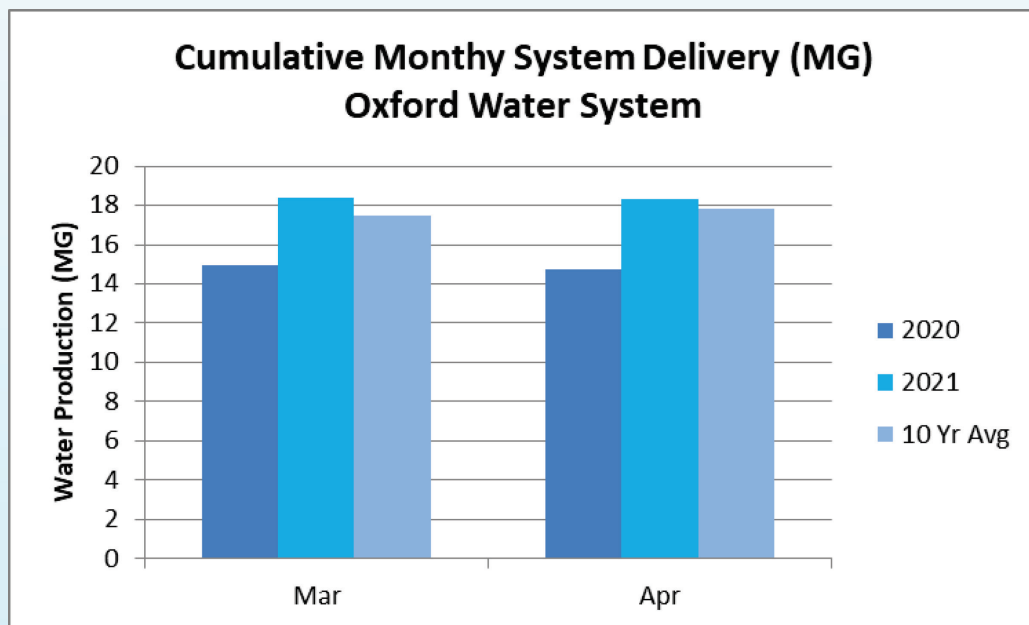
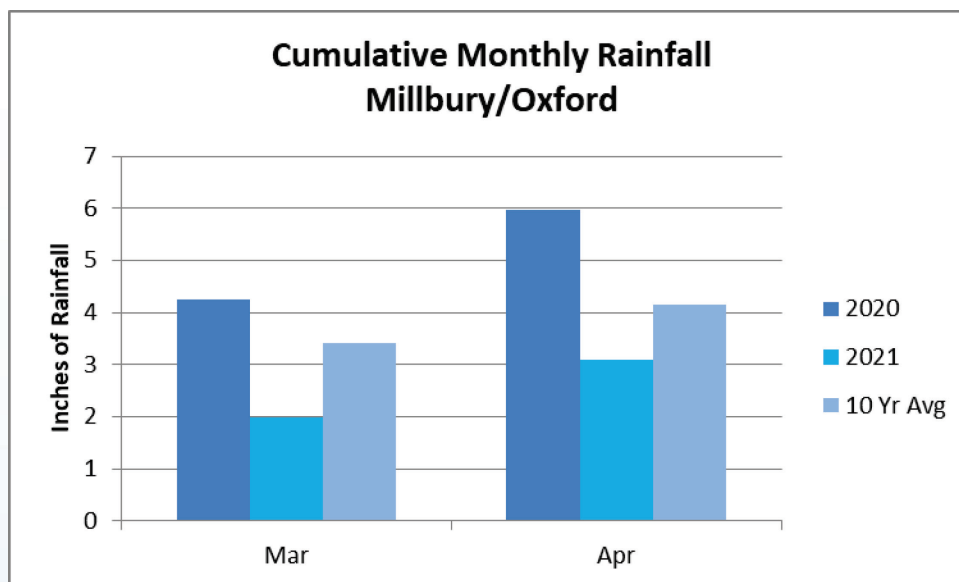


Water Supply Update

Weather Trends

Precipitation for March was 1.99 inches, which is 1.43 inches below the 10-year average precipitation for the month of March. April was 1.06 inches below average at 3.09 inches.



Water Supply and Demand

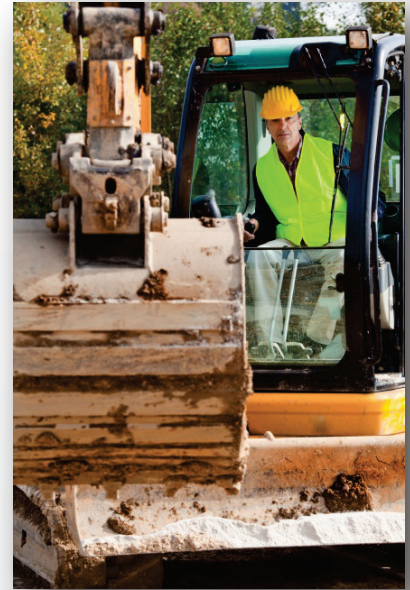
Water demands through the months of March and April were approximately 17% higher than 2020 and were also above the 10-year average. The average amount of water delivered to our system to meet demands in March was 594,350 gallons per day (GPD) and 591,420 GPD in April.



Recent and Upcoming Water Main Upgrades

Oxford's water mains may be out of sight but they're never out of Aquarion's mind. To maintain water quality and reduce service disruptions caused by broken water mains, we have an ongoing program of distribution system improvements.

The most frequent work involves flushing mains to remove sediment that can cause discolored water. The most visible work takes place when we replace old or damaged mains, often in concert with local road improvement projects. Here's an update on recent projects in Oxford:



- **Prospect Hill Tank Rehab** – To maintain our high standard of water quality and service, we've scheduled a rehabilitation project for the Prospect Hill tank. Construction will begin on May 24, 2021 and will last between 12 to 14 weeks.
- **Church Street Water Main Replacement** – Construction will begin May 24, 2021 and will last approximately 3 to 4 weeks.
- **Oxford Water Main Cleaning** – Cleaning began on April 5 and will continue through the first week of June. Weekly street schedules are available on our website at www.aquarionwater.com/alerts.
