



Water Supply Update

Weather Trends/Outlook

Precipitation in August totaled 4.8 inches compared to the long term average of 3.5 inches. Over the past 12 months, total precipitation is 4.4 inches below average. Average monthly temperature was 73°F; 5°F above the historical average.

Current Water Use Restrictions

Currently, no drought conditions occur on the Seacoast.

There are currently no local water use restrictions, but residents are advised to follow prudent lawn watering practices (watering only one-half inches of water twice per week between the hours of 7 pm and 7 am) in order to minimize the probability of mandatory water use restrictions later this year.

Aquarion Improving Hampton System Water Mains

Aquarion Water Company will be cleaning water mains in the Hampton, North Hampton and Rye from Monday, September 10 through mid-November, so we can ensure that you continue to receive the highest quality water.

This project should last approximately ten weeks and, during that time, you might notice some discoloration in your water. This discoloration results from the temporary disturbance of the water flow, which stirs up naturally occurring minerals that settle in water mains.

You may want to store tap water in the refrigerator ahead of time for drinking and cooking. And, if your water is discolored, delay washing clothes until it is clear.

We appreciate your understanding and patience. Our crew will begin in the neighborhoods around Exeter Road in Hampton. Work will be performed on weekdays between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm.
