It's Time to Conserve – Southwest Fairfield County Hits Drought Triggers

Summer's here, and it's brought dry weather and high water demands along with it. The result? We're hitting drought triggers in Southwest Fairfield County. Meanwhile, other parts of the state are currently experiencing conditions ranging from "abnormally dry" to "moderate drought."

So, how can you help? We're asking customers that live in Darien, Greenwich, New Canaan, Newtown, Stamford, and Westport to reduce water usage 20 percent and follow the mandatory, irrigation schedule. If you live outside of these six towns, we encourage you to voluntarily follow this schedule as an easy way to conserve water.

But there are still many ways to use water more efficiently, indoors and out. Outdoors, you can fix or replace leaky hoses, and get your irrigation system tuned up.
